This brings to a total the number of engineers and technicians trained through this course, just in the last 6 months, to over seventy in Malaysia alone - a clear commitment by all those who have invested in this training, to raising the standards of effective and accurate assessment and reporting of sewer pipeline conditions, and will no doubt deliver real benefits in their organisations and companies sewer networks assets management decision making.
